Kitten Wellness Plan



Congratulations on the addition of a new kitten to your family. The doctors and staff at College Village Animal Clinic

are excited to help you provide the best care possible for your new family member. We have developed our kitten wellness plan to include all the necessary exams, vaccinations, deworming, and lab tests needed to get your kitten started on a long and healthy life. Keeping your new kitten happy and healthy is important and we are here to help you along the way. Our kitten wellness plan represents substantial savings on veterinary services during the first year of your pet's life.

WELL KITTEN OFFICE VISITS

At each visit, the doctor will perform a complete physical exam to evaluate your kitten for any signs of illness. They will also cover many different topics for discussion including training, nutrition, oral care, and spay/neuter. These visits are a great opportunity for you and your kitten to get to know the doctors and staff of College Village Animal Clinic. If you have any questions this is also an excellent time to ask the doctor or technician.

VACCINES

FVRCP - This is a combination vaccine containing feline viral rhinotracheitis, calicivirus, and panleukopenia. These are

different viruses that cause respiratory and intestinal disease. They are all quite contagious and difficult to treat.

FelV - This is a vaccine for the feline leukemia virus. FelV is the most common cause of cancer in cats, it may cause various blood disorders, and it may lead to a state of immune deficiency that hinders the cat's ability to protect itself against other infections.

Rabies - This is a prevention for the rabies virus. Rabies is a fatal virus that affects the nervous system. It is spread to people and animals by bites from infected animals. Rabies is nearly untreatable once symptoms begin and vaccination is required by law.

OTHER SERVICES

Deworming

Kittens are vulnerable to parasite infestations that can seriously threaten their health and that of your family. Our wellness package will provide three treatments of an oral dewormer given two weeks apart to protect against intestinal parasites.

Toe Nail Trims

Nail trimming isn't something to dread. We will help you get started early which will allow your kitten to get accustomed to having their nails trimmed.

LABORATORY TESTS

Fecal Exam – This tests for intestinal parasites. Unfortunately, kittens can acquire intestinal parasites from their mother before birth or while nursing. They can also become infected through parasite

eggs in the feces of other animals. Some intestinal parasites kittens can get are transmissible to humans and can cause serious disease. We perform this test in the clinic through a centrifugation process. This test allows us better evaluation and identification of parasite eggs in the feces.

FelV/FIV Test – This is a blood test screening for the feline leukemia virus and feline immunodeficiency virus. Kittens and cats infected with these viruses often do not live past 3-5 years old. Neither virus is treatable and they are very contagious to other cats in the house.

Blood Panel – At the final visit, we will draw a blood sample to be sent to an outside lab. This test includes a complete blood count and a number of blood chemistries. The complete blood count will help the doctor determine if your kitten is anemic (low red blood cell count) or has an infection (high white blood cell count). The chemistries will help the doctor evaluate your kitten's liver and kidney function. Changes in these values may be indicative of congenital defect or problem that needs to be treated. If you plan to spay or neuter your puppy, this blood test is a great pre-operative screen before anesthesia.
